## About the Dwight Hall Socially Responsible Investment Fund

The Dwight Hall Socially Responsible Investment (SRI) Fund is the first undergraduate-run socially responsible investment fund in the country. With the support of Dwight Hall Trustees, our

team of 27 Yale undergraduates employs a modern approach to socially responsible investing that aims to outperform investment benchmarks while at the same time registering a positive social and environmental impact.

### **About Dwight Hall at Yale**

The mission of Dwight Hall at Yale is to foster civic-minded student leaders and to promote service and activism in New Haven and around the world. Dwight Hall, a not-for-profit organization independent of Yale, was founded by undergraduates in 1886 and has operated continuously since then as a student-initiated service organization.

Dwight Hall encourages and nurtures student service and justice initiatives, by guiding and supporting the creation of new organizations tackling urgent and emerging issues or by strengthening and building the capacity of existing student groups. In this way, Dwight Hall's organizations, fellowships, and resources support the transformation of students into "civic-minded student leaders" by encouraging students to share best practices, learn from successful leaders, and collaborate on solving societal challenges.

Dwight Hall currently supports more than 90 student-led member groups and Fellowships which contribute over 150,000 hours of direct service and advocacy each year. Its base of 3,500 volunteers per year is among the largest in the United States.
